






RISE OF GLP-1RA's ("OZEMPIC")



Unique Challenges

- Healthcare provider access

Types of Medicare Advantage Supplemental Benefits

Traditional primarily health-related benefits (2018 and earlier)

- Vision
- Dental
- Hearing
- Fitness
- Over-the-counter benefits
- Limited additional services, such as:
- rides to medical appointments
- certain number of meals following inpatient stays
- home-based paillative care

Expanded primarily health-related benefits (starting in 2019)

- All traditional primarily health-related benefits
- Expanded additional services, such as:
- more-generous meal benefits
- additional rides
- New services, such as:
- adult day care
- community-based services
- caregiver support

Special Supplemental Benefits for the Chronically III (starting in 2020)

- Complementary therapies
- Pest control
- Food and produce
