
## Healthy Food Financing Initiatives

## **Healthy Food Financing Initiatives**

Healthy Food Financing Initiatives (HFFIs) are grocery financing programs designed to improve access to healthy food and expand economic opportunity in underserved areas.





#### **Types of Projects Funded by HFFIs**





- · Grocery stores
- · Co-ops
- Corner stores
- · Bodegas
- Farmers markets
- Mobile markets










#### Healthy Food Financing Initiative Model



#### **National Healthy Food Financing Initiative**

- Federal HFFI Launched in 2011 by the U.S. Departments of Treasury (through the CDFI Fund), Agriculture, and Health and Human Services.
- Active Federal HFFI Programs in 2022:
  - <u>America's Healthy Food</u>
    <u>Financing Initiative</u> (through USDA)
    - Annual funding given directly to healthy food retail projects
  - CDFI Fund HFFI (through US)

<u>Treasury)</u>

 Annual funding given to CDFIs to then fund projects in regions they serve
